PUNKIN CHUNKIN 2009

ALIENS OF THE AMAZON World Premiere Sunday, November 15 at 9 PM [TV-G]

A team of scientists venture deep into the Amazon to discover some of the most unfamiliar and bizarre creatures in the jungle, called Treehoppers. As masters of disguise, with a range of fantastical forms and impressive structures, these strange animals speak using vibrations; ward off prey by forming unlikely alliances with other creatures; and mate by attracting partners in a peculiar manner.
