RUNNING FROM CRAZY

Monday, August 4 (6:30 p.m. – 9:00 p.m. ET/PT)

The Emmy-nominated documentary "Running From Crazy" from two-time Academy Awardwinning filmmaker Barbara Kopple examines the personal journey of Academy Awardnominated actress and mental health advocate Mariel Hemingway, the granddaughter of writer Ernest Hemingway, as she strives for a deeper understanding of the suicide and mental illness that have afflicted so many of her family members, including her supermodel sister, Margaux Hemingway and her oldest sister, artist Joan "Muffet" Hemingway.
