Monthly highlights include a new special of "The Aquabats! Super Show!" and the Hub Network premiere of several movies, including "Happy Feet" and "The Polar Express."

"The Aquabats! Super Show!" (Saturday, 1–1:30 p.m.)

But when another designer ruins Rarity's chances at winning the competition, she discovers that the Devil wears Pony-Rada.
